Paws For Progress



Edinburgh Dog and Cat Home is delighted to announce the relaunch of it's partnership with Paws for Progress. Through the UK's first Rescue Dog Training Programme created by Paws for Progress, Young Offenders at HMP and YOI Polmont will work with dogs from Edinburgh Dog and Cat Home, offering life changing opportunities for both young people and our dogs.

Paws for Progress is a local Community Interest Company that originated as a PhD research project at the University of Stirling, working in partnership with the Scottish Prison Service over the last decade to help young offenders through teaching them to train dogs from local rescue organisations.

The rescue dogs selected for the Paws for Progress programme have all been working hard with the kennel training team and are identified as having a huge amount of potential, which makes them great candidates for the Paws for Progress 'Pup School'. Participating in the programme allows rescue dogs to build on their training and work on their socialisation, whilst the Home continue the search for their forever homes.

Recently we have seen Poppy and Ghost from the Home working on their new training skills. They both did a fanstastic job and here is what one of their students had to say: "I enjoyed working with different dogs and learning more about them. It was fun building up a relationship with Poppy and teaching her new tricks. Keeping Poppy focussed and concentrating could be a little difficult, but we kept patient and Poppy was really good."

DOG FIRST AID

Since December we have delivered to 81 foodbanks, run 12 pop-up foodbanks, and given out 16,000 meals.

As the cost of living rises, so has the need for additional support, and in response we have increased the number of foodbanks we work with by taking Paws Pantry on the road and delivering 'pop up' services in the community.

These foodbanks are one-stop shops for dog and cat owners, with supplies of food, toys, treats, jackets, beds and enrichment materials, all of which can be accessed by the public with no referral or criteria. By working with established organisations, we can get to the heart of communities and provide support for people and their pets, and reach those who would not otherwise be able to access our services.

As part of the rise in cost of living, we are seeing a growing fuel poverty crisis across Scotland. At the end of 2021 we began operating our dog winter jacket fitting service in the community to help dog owners keep their pets warm over winter and access other support at the same time.

Rico's Story

Rico is just one of many dogs who we have helped through Paws Pantry. He previously spent most of his time being kept in a cage in the corner of a room, according to his new owner, *Paul and he knew he wanted to offer him a better life.

Paul had just moved into the local community and was told about Paws Panty through word of mouth. Rico just had a chain slip lead at this point and Paul was worried about the costs of keeping Rico.

Upon meeting Rico at one of our pop-up venues, we did a top to tail examination of Rico and talked about what items he needed, such as a harness, lead, food and toys. Paul will be back monthly to see us and we look forward to being able to continue support him and



Advocating For Animals

In the past six months we have continued to use our voice to help improve the lives of dogs, cats and pet owners.

We have joined forces with animal welfare organisations across the UK to call on the governments of the four nations to put an end to greyhound racing. We believe that there is no space for this cruel sport which harms so many greyhounds every year and would like to see a full ban in place in Scotland and the UK.

We have also lent our voice to several Scottish Government consultations, including the Commercial and Non-Commercial Movements of Pets into Great Britain and the Ending the Need for Food Banks consultation.

We will continue to speak out for animal welfare and those facing pet poverty to affect change locally and nationally.


Whatever It Takes

When people hear the name Edinburgh Dog and Cat Home, they think of the hundreds of vulnerable animals we rescue and rehome. What doesn't always spring to mind, is the intense work that goes on behind the scenes to prepare our dogs and cats for their new life.

One of the biggest challenges our kennel team has been faced with over the last two years is the increase in the number of reactive young dogs being brought to the Home.

Thanks to the generosity of our community, we are fortunate enough to have a passionate and experienced training team on site. Our team works closely with all resident dogs who struggle with anxiety and unwanted behaviours.

Whilst working with these animals on a long term basis, we also continue to rescue new dogs and cats who need our help. Pressure on our resources is mounting and we need your support to help us keep going for animals like Tazz.



Meet Tazz

Tazz, a lively Staffordshire Bull Terrier, arrived at the Home in September 2021 as a stray.

On arrival, Tazz was nervous yet very energetic. When he got excited, he became difficult to control, and was easily frustrated. His background was a mystery, and it was evident that he hadn't felt safe or content for a long time.

Our dedicated training team quickly identified that Tazz needed a lot of socialisation training to change his behaviour towards other people and dogs.

After a few weeks of consistent one-to-one training with the same staff members, Tazz made encouraging progress. He is now more trusting, which in turn has reduced reactivity.

We will do whatever it takes for every animal in our care.

While some of our team are spending one-to-one time with the dogs who need it most, many of our other animals still need to be cared for, taken to the vet, and get that vital enrichment and human interaction. time.

Having a remarkable dog training team to support dogs like Tazz is incredibly beneficial to our animals, their mental health, and our dreams of finding them all new loving forever homes. Their second chance is only possible thanks to wonderful donations from people like you.

Please help us to help more animals like our newly reformed Tazz.
