# **FUNDRAISING TOP TIPS**

To help you get started we've put together some fundraising hints and tips... and don't forget our friendly team are happy to help too!





### **Getting set up**

Once you've chosen your fundraising event, it's time to let people know what you're doing and set up a page to collect donations. We recommend:



- JustGiving a great way to get donations for your fundraising and share updates on how your challenge or event is going along the way.
- Tickets if you're organising a ticketed challenge or event, there's lots of different platforms you can use, from Ticket Tailor and Try Booking to Eventbrite. Each platform works a little bit differently, and if you're charging for your tickets, make sure you understand the fees.
- A Facebook event or fundraising page perfect for unticketed events. Invite friends and family and don't forget to encourage them to donate on your fundraising page, or via edch.org.uk/donate
- In person remember to reach out to your family, friends, or colleagues directly as well. Whether virtual or in person, make sure you record all donations and ticket sales and if you're doing a challenge, have a sponsorship form.

## 2 Kickstart your fundraising early

- Early engagement –
   Let people know when you
   first start fundraising and
   keep them updated on your
   progress. This will help to
   build a strong connection
   and support.
- If you are looking for a way to get your fundraiser started, why not try making a donation yourself? People who donate to their own fundraising page raise on average 47% more!

## 3 Share your story

- Explain why you have chosen to fundraise for the Home. A personal touch can go a long way.
- When you connect with your supporters on a personal level, more people are likely to support you!



Here's a few examples you could share to let them know where their money's going:



could help provide a cat with the **vaccines** they need to be safely rehomed.



could help fuel our **foodbank** van for a week.



could help keep a dog warm in the Home for **three months.**

## 6 Invite your friends

- Share a link to your fundraiser on your social media pages - Facebook, Instagram, Tiktok and X (Twitter).
- Online platforms like
   Eventbrite and Facebook
   are great ways to invite
   guests to your events.
   If you're going to charge
   a ticket price, remember
   to set it at a realistic level
   to get as many people
   involved as possible.
- Share your fundraiser page link with friends and family over text, WhatsApp or email. Try not to share without any context - tell them what you've been up to in your fundraising journey or why you've chosen to fundraise for the Home.



# **1** Keep people updated

Everyone will love to see how your fundraising is going. Share pictures of your **training and preparation, videos and stories**, and remind them of your fundraising target.



Remember to **tag your supporters** when you thank them so more people can see it.



## **Share your success!**

Once your fundraising is complete share the total with your family, friends and colleagues to let them know what they've helped to achieve.

## **WHERE YOUR MONEY GOES**



In 2024 we helped over 650 dogs and cats



### **Pet Food Banks**

In 2024 we distributed **599,145 pet meals** to families in East and Central Scotland – the equivalent of providing vital food for almost **70 animals every hour.** 



## **Surrender** requests

2024 saw a staggering **1,233 surrender requests.** 



### Helpline

Our helpline answered **26,867** calls from pet owners in need.



We accepted 381 animals into our care



We found loving homes for 174 dogs and 54 cats



Reunited 79 dogs and 24 cats with worried owners









## **MORAY'S STORY**

It's been 12 years since Moray, a Kelpie cross, went home with Tim and his partner, Michael. Since then, he's lived a life full of adventure!



Moray came to the Home as a stray and Tim tells us that he 'chose them' to be his new family. Moray was around 1-year-old when he went to his forever home – he was house-trained and familiar with basic commands. Rehoming Moray was a steep learning curve for Tim and Michael – they had to learn how to manage Moray's high-energy breed traits and slight reactivity. Tim tells us that he can be a little anxious around dogs he doesn't know, and easily spooked by sudden movements. 'He wears a yellow 'I need space' bandana when we're out. He's usually fine and we just try to avoid situations that might spook him.' Tim adds that he does enjoy playing on the beach with dog friends who he knows!

Moray's days in his forever home have been filled with **mountain climbing, camping, and plenty of cuddles**. Before he retired, his owner, Tim, worked as a mountain guide, leading hiking trips across Scotland. Moray loved to go to work with him and his presence was often specifically requested by Tim's clients!

Moray and Tim still head out on a lot of overnight adventures in the hills. He has his own little camping mat and Tim describes these trips as **'incredibly bonding'**, sharing that, 'At first, I took a while to work out how much he would enjoy it and how much he would be capable of. Now, 12 years on, it's, it's me that's slowing down with age not him!'

Moray's favourite things include swimming in the river, playing in the garden with his big red ball, and long snoozy cuddles.
